At last now that the Government has finally lifted all Covid restrictions, we feel able to hold our annual general meeting. The meeting was cancelled last year because of the pandemic, and postponed from our usual February slot this year for the same reason.

Please take this as notice that the Society's annual general meeting will be held on **Saturday, April 30**, starting at **2pm. Please note the new afternoon start.**

There is a new venue, as unfortunately Golding Homes is no longer letting out the Eling Court Day Centre. We will meet at the **King George V Pavillion**, off Walnut Tree Avenue in Loose, **ME15 9RN**.

The AGM is your opportunity as a member to hear reports of all the Society's activities during the past two years. Importantly it is also the best opportunity to raise any concerns you may have or to proffer any suggestions or ideas for the future course of the Society. The meeting must end by 4pm. Coffee and tea will be served.

In accordance with the constitution, all the existing executive committee members must step down and members will have the opportunity to re-elect them or to elect new members. (Any nominations must be received in writing by the secretary by April 15.) The AGM will include an open session for points raised from the floor, but members can also ask for items to be placed on the agenda by prior notice to the secretary Alan Smith on 01622 751926 or email a128smith@btinternet.com (before April 1 please).

Of course, to vote you must be a paid-up member of the Society, and so it is time once again to ask you to renew your membership subscription for 2022 if you have not already done so. A membership application is attached at the end of this newsletter. We are retaining the membership fee at the nominal sum of £2 per person, but of course we are always happy to receive additional donations. Your membership can also be renewed on the door at the AGM.

Change to the Constitution: The present constitution requires us to hold the AGM *in January or as soon as practicable thereafter.*

We have always found meeting in January difficult because of the need to have the accounts for the year prepared and audited before the meeting. In addition, we are aware that on several occasions

when we have held the AGM in February, there has been snow on the ground.

The following resolution is therefore proposed by the Secretary

That in Section N (1) of the Constitution, the word January be replaced with April.

The result would be that we would be required to hold the AGM in April or as soon as practicable thereafter. The motion will require a two-thirds majority to pass.

Conservation Cabin roof

The Conservation Cabin in Cave Hill has been given a new roof as the old one had started to rot. This was a large undertaking, thought to be beyond the skills of our work party team, and initially the executive committee sought quotes from builders to carry out the work – which came back in excess of £13,000!

Long-standing VCS member Steve Small, who is a professional carpenter, then offered his skills and did the job in two days, assisted by the work party. Steve declined to accept any payment.

A huge thank- you to Steve, and also a shout-out to executive committee member John Smith who arranged the purchase and delivery of the materials.

The opportunity was taken to effect some improvements to the design, including the extension of the roof to create an overhang, so that the work party can have some shelter to eat their sandwiches under when it is raining.



Abbeygate development

We wrote to Tovil Parish Council asking that the issue of the Local Plan Review proposal for 250 homes at Abbeygate Farm off Stockett Lane be placed on the agenda for discussion by the parish councillors.

The request was denied. This seems odd, since the propsal requires the forging of a new road across the Walnut Tree Meadow Nature Reserve, which is run by the Hayle Park Nature Reserve Trust. Three members of the nine trustees are nominated by the parish council.

We also contacted our MP Helen Grant, but she had nothing useful to contribute.

VCS calendars

We are delighted to report that the 2022 VCS calenders went like hot cakes and were quickly sold out. Thanks very much to our member Michael Innocent whose initiative this was and who saw the project through with the printers. It netted the society a proft of £250.

Sad start to the year


