Barbecue

After two years' absence due to Covid, the VCS barbeque will be back this year.

Tickets will go on sale at the AGM, and can be obtained from the secretary after that.

Those who can remember our last barbecue in 2019 will recall it was, if anything, too popular, with large crowds resulting in long queues for food.

Your Committee is determined to avoid such a situation again this year and so will be **strictly** limiting the number of admissions to 100. (There were 180 in 2019!)

In addition, in the past we have allowed members to bring non-member guests. You will still be able to do so, but no more than two guests per member. There will be no-joining members on the day, so if you need to sign someone up as a member please do so in advance.

The barbecue will be on Saturday, July 23. Doors open at 3pm, food will be available from 4pm. It will be held in the gardens of The Manor at Hayle Place, courtesy of Jane Holman.

Vegan dishes will be available, but only if ordered in advance. The cost will be £12.50 for members, and £15 for non-members. Children under 14 remain free.

There will be chicken, sausages and burgers on the coals, with salad accompaniments, followed by a fresh fruit dessert. All food is included in the ticket price. Bring your own tables, chairs and drinks. Please, no dogs.
