Advance notice of AGM

It will soon be time for the Society to hold its annual meeting.

The date has been set for Saturday, April 12, starting at 10am, and the venue will be the same as last year, the King George V Pavilion off Walnut Tree Lane in Loose, ME15 9RG.

It will be your chance to hear reports from the executive committee on our activities during the past year and to raise any suggestions or ideas.

The Society's audited accounts will also be presented.

It is also your opportunity to elect new committee members for the coming year.

It is anticipated that some of our existing committee will be stepping down this time, so there is space for anyone who feels they can lend a hand.

The executive committee meetings take place once a month, usually on the first Wednesday of the month, and most committee members also take on some extra role according to their skill set, and all help out at events such as the annual barbecue.

Repair Café – help needed

We expect some members will already have heard of Repair Cafés – and perhaps even visited the two that already operate in Maidstone, at Bearsted and in the market buildings in the town centre.

Recently a group of like-minded Tovil residents have got together to form a new group called Carbon Action Tovil (CAT for short).

Their aim is to encourage people to take a more responsible approach towards the planet's resources – cutting back on plastic consumption, encouraging walking and cycling etc.



Their first big project coming up is to organise a Repair Café in Tovil.

The idea is that people bring along their broken or damaged items and volunteers will do their best to fix them – and so avoid their items being just thrown away.

The event will be on Saturday, March 8 from 2pm till 4pm.

The CAT group is asking whether any VCS members would be willing to lend hand?

They need people with a skill in electrics, woodwork, or computers, sewing, bicycle maintenance – anything really that might be handy.

The "Café" part of the Repair Café is that refreshments are offered and there is the chance to sit and have a cake and a natter at the event.

So CAT would also like to hear from anyone who can bake a few buns or can serve at the tea counter on the day.

There's also a need for volunteers to (wo)man a registration desk and direct visitors to the right repairer.

There is a chance to find out more by attending a meeting of the CAT group this Monday. They are gathering in the side room of the Tovil Workingmen's Club (ME15 6QS) on Monday, January 27, at 6.30pm. All welcome – even if not from Tovil!
