

Bryn Cornwell



It is with a very heavy heart that we have to inform members of the death of our chairman, Bryn Cornwell.

Bryn passed away on February 11, at home, with his wife, Freda, and daughter, Sharon, by his side.

The Valley Conservation Society was founded on 28th July, 2000. It took us a few months to hammer out a constitution, which was formally adopted on 13th December, 2000, with Bryn as one of the 12 founding signatories.

Bryn became the group's chairman in 2002 and had been re-elected by the members each year since.

Even before VCS owned any land of its own, Bryn toiled - with John Smith, Dave Cole and others - to make our environment a better place, cutting, for example, a path along the river front in Tovil towards Bydews Wood, and regularly clearing debris from the culvert gratings on the Loose Stream.

After VCS was able to buy its own grounds, Bryn established and led the regular Tuesday work parties.

Bryn was not born a countryman – in fact before moving to Stockett Lane in 1981, he had spent most of his life in London. He was born in Hounslow, which was then in Middlesex, but from the age of seven he lived in Catford, in south London.

He served for 28 years as a fireman and later Station Commander, for the London Fire Brigade.

During that time, he received an award from the Royal Humane Society for saving the life of an unconscious woman whom he pulled from a burning building, and then revived with mouth-to-mouth resuscitation, keeping her breathing for 30 minutes until the ambulance came.

After he arrived in Kent, Bryn became passionate about our countryside and took courses to qualify in chainsaw-handling and in ragstone walling, and as a pond-warden, so that he could lead the work party more effectively.

Members of the executive committee who served with him will tell you of his meticulousness – nothing could be done that wasn't strictly by the rulebook, and no minutes would be approved until not only the context was accurate, but also every little typo corrected.

Members will recall him as the genial figure with a beer can in one hand and a pair of tongs in the other, as he turned over the chicken pieces at the annual barbecue.

Those with longer memories will know that before VCS was formed, Bryn had also been a committee member for the Loose Amenities Association - a group that performs a similar role to VCS at the other end of the Loose Valley - where he worked closely with Roy Hood.

He was also one of the original nine trustees of the Hayle Park Nature Reserve.
