Time to renew membership

As we are now well into the new year of 2026, it is time for members to renew their subscriptions.

Our annual membership remains at just £2 a person, although we appreciate that many people top that up with a donation, for which we are truly grateful.

Apart from stationery and printing, the Society has no administration costs as all the work is done by volunteers. This means that all of your membership subscription will be used to maintain the land that we own in the Loose Valley.

A reminder for new members: we own Treacle Wood (an area of woodland on the eastern side of Hayle Mill Road), Crisbrook Bank (a small patch of land just north of Upper Crisbrook Mill), the Conservation Cabin (off Cave Hill), the Reeds and Lower Crisbrook Millponds, and Crisbrook Meadow (owned jointly with Tovil Parish Council).

Treacle Wood is not open to the public because there is no easy access to it (you need a step ladder), and because it is the nesting place of the kingfishers, which are such a beautiful feature of the valley and which we don't want to see disturbed.

The millponds and Crisbrook Meadow, however, are open to the public all year round and attract scores of visitors every day.

The Society also owns one-third of the adjacent Hayle Park Nature Reserve. The reserve is run separately by the Hayle Park Nature Reserve Trust and does its own fundraising, but the Society and the reserve help each other out, often sharing the use of equipment.

Many people pay their subscriptions by standing order, which helps cut down on the paperwork. Sadly, we can no longer accept cheques as the bank has begun charging us 50p each time to process them. Bank transfers are acceptable. See the application form at the back of this newsletter.

Bryn

It is now nearly a year since the Society sadly lost Bryn Cornwell, one of our 12 founding members and our chairman for 23 years, to mesothelioma.

In January, the Society invited his widow, Fred, and his family to plant a silver birch tree at Treacle Wood in Bryn's memory.



Afterwards, a plaque in his honour was unveiled on the side of the Conservation Cabin and Fred was presented with a book of photographs of Bryn compiled by the executive committee.

Bryn is still greatly missed both by members of the work party, which Bryn had led for over two decades, and by the executive committee, and indeed by all the VCS members who knew him.

Traffic calming

The committee of volunteers who are looking into traffic-calming measures for the Loose Valley are currently engaged in preparing a questionnaire to present to the public to ask for their views on the various options.

The plan is that initially, the questionnaire will go out to those residents who live in the Loose Valley (about 100 households) to gather the views of those who would be most directly affected by any change.

Based on these findings, the options would be refined before an extended survey is undertaken of households in the wider area, such as the Broadoak estate and the top end of Cripple Street.

In the meantime, Tom Bartlett, who is chairing the committee, would like to receive any evidence of traffic problems, such as HGVs stuck on a bend, damage to properties, or injured animals, that might be used to support our case.

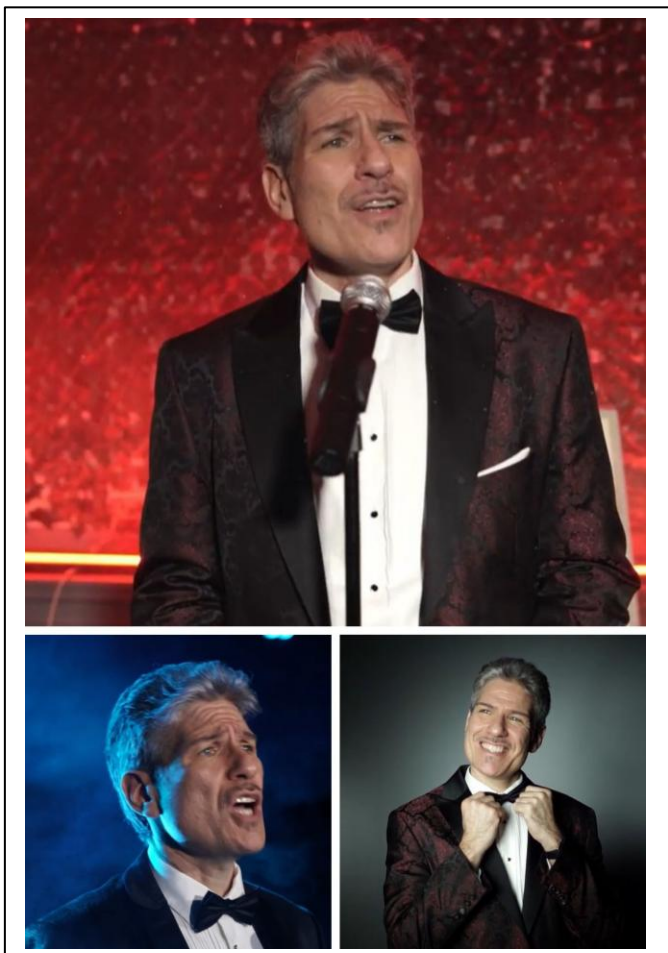
Now comes the news that immediately following the Cave Hill closure, Cripple Street is to be closed near the top of Teasaucer Hill for gas main repairs for another three weeks.
